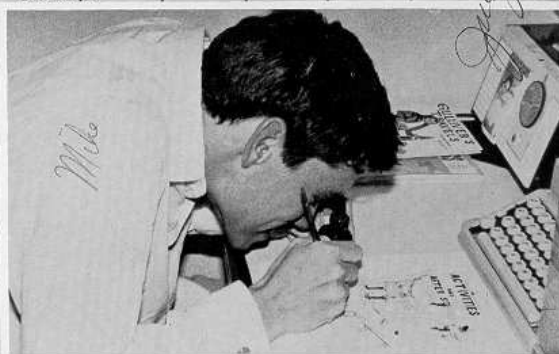

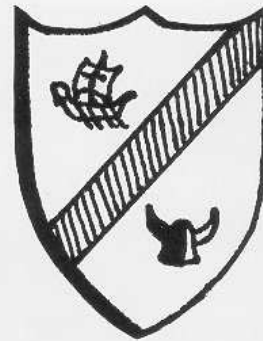
Student Council

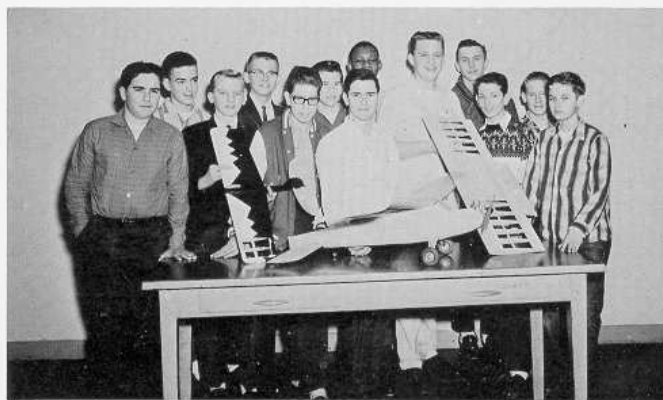
