The class of '63 will always be remembered for their contributions to the customs and traditions that will become a part of Dreux High School.



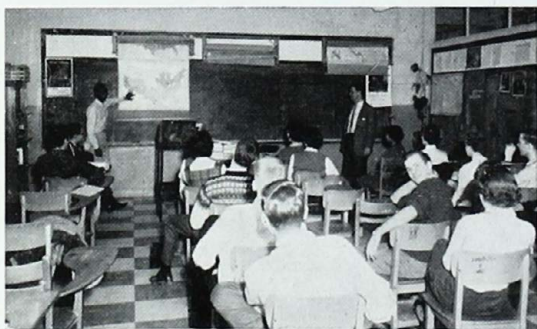

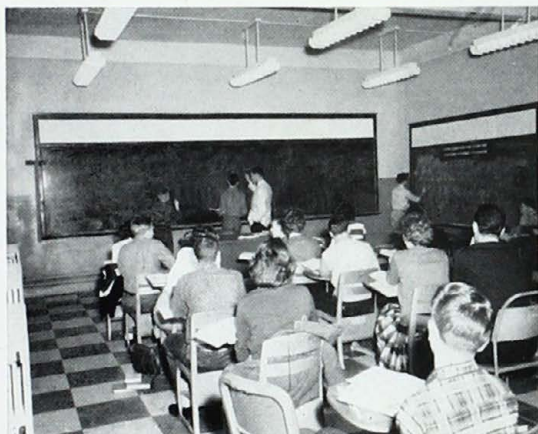
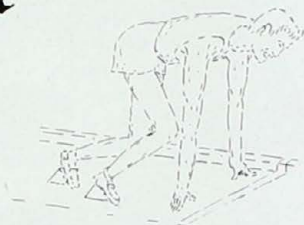
Freshman Class History

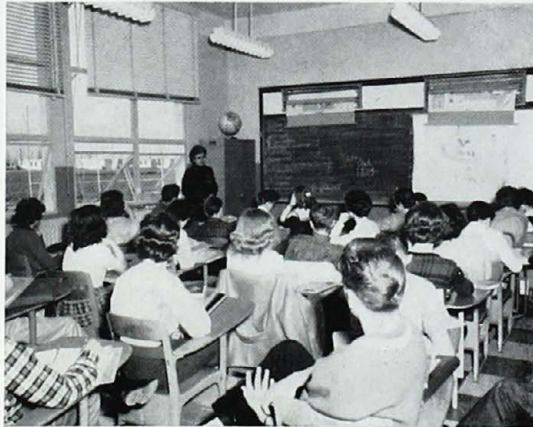

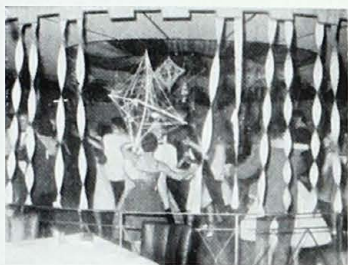

The responsibility of laying the foundation for a new school was assumed by the Student Council, as we were the coordinating government body of the students. Immediately we were faced with a host of problems, among them organizing the various classes and clubs, establishing desirable traditions, and promoting ideals for the future.

We believe we have measured up to the task which was placed before us.

The Student Council set up at Dreux was a provisional one; it continued, however, throughout the year. There was one representative from each of the four classes and from certain homerooms. Six permanent committees were formed to take care of all business. Out of these came such enterprises as the Honor Squad, comprised of outstanding students from the upper classes, and the choosing of the school historian, who keeps a permanent and interesting record of our institution.

At the beginning of the year the Council screened

suggestions for the school colors and the team name; these were then voted upon by the student body. The "Normandy Vikings" now sport red and white uniforms and follow the school flag bearing our crest.

The Seniors were given the responsibility of choosing class rings. The design picked by them has become traditional, as ruled by the Council. We provided the students with an information pamphlet on the library and arranged for several assemblies.

Perhaps our most important achievement was the adoption of the Student Council Constitution and the establishment of a permanent record file. These will help guide students in the future on such matters as government and traditions.

Through the combined efforts of the Council and the student body Dreux American High School has attained an equal standing in the community of American high schools overseas.
